A Reading from the Thirty First Chapter of Jeremiah, beginning at verse 7

For thus says the Lord:

Sing aloud with gladness for Jacob,
and raise shouts for the chief of the nations;

8 See, I am going to bring them from the land of the north,
and gather them from the farthest parts of the earth,

Then they started to look for him among their relatives and friends. 45 When they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem to search for him. 46 After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. 47 And all who heard him were amazed at his understanding and his answers. 48 When his parents saw him they were astonished; and his mother said to him, "Child, why have you treated us like this? Look, your father and I have been searching for you in great anxiety." 49 He said to them, "Why were you searching for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" 50 But they did not understand what he said to them. 51 Then he went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them. come at least spiritually into my heart.


I embrace You as if You were already there
